We asked Will to share a little something about himself for this edition of the Point of View.

I grew up in the Coachella Valley in Southern California and spent much of my formative time in the small mountain art community of Idyllwild. I graduated from La Quinta High School in 2002 and began working in cultural resources management while simultaneously starting college in Los Angeles. During my college years, I acquired a variety of experiences, from working as a planning technician to working at a lumber mill in northern California. The bulk of my career has been spent in the deserts of the Southwest, doing field archaeology primarily for private companies contracted for energy and transportation projects. This work continued to pull me further east into Arizona and dropped me off here in Verde Valley, where after only a few days I was determined to stay.

Archaeology can sometimes be called a lifestyle choice rather than simply a career path, an assessment I agree with wholeheartedly, as hopefully many will. It becomes a lens through which you view not



only the landscape, but also human interactions on the landscape. Looking around my new adoptive Town of Jerome, I see a landscape layered with the triumphs and tragedies of the past, the complications of the present, and the hopes of an unwritten future. Mindful of the unique and deeply layered history we share, I hope to help the town realize its future while preserving our history.

Prescott National Forest Outlook/Conditions

Even with the winter storms that are few and far between, please be aware that Jerome will still be lacking in moisture this year; the light fuels are extremely dry. Be extremely cautious! With conditions the way they are now, we can expect a very active fire season this summer due to that additional growth from recent snow and rainstorms. Last year Arizona had one of the driest, busiest wildland seasons on record and current predictions are for more of the same. Please do what you can to remediate any dead fuels within 100 feet of your property if possible! Give Chief Blair a call if you need access to our brush/slash pile to drop off your trimmings. Also, if you have any hot ash, charcoal briquettes, or partially burned firewood, place into a metal container with water for at least a day before disposal.

Fire extinguishers: Jerome Fire Department would like to thank all of the residents that took advantage of this year's annual fire extinguisher maintenance program with Life, Safety and Property company. For a small fee, we provide this service every February to ensure that your fire extinguishers function properly in the event you might need to use them. Please take advantage of this program each year.

File of Life and "Rescue Pet" Stickers

We have magnetic **Files of Life** cards available at the fire station that help first responders contact the right person(s) in the event of an emergency. These must be placed on the refrigerator so we can easily

find the information. Only the person(s) listed on these cards can be contacted by the Fire Department in case of an emergency.

We also have "Rescue Pet" stickers used to alert first responders of pets in the house. These stickers should be placed on or near the front door. This alerts firefighters of potential rescues inside the building and lets EMTs know what pets to care for or keep inside if the house is left unattended. TOWN MANAGER AND TOWN CLERK

With the approaching retirement of Town Manager/Clerk Candace Gallagher, Jerome is seeking a qualified individual to fill those positions. A combined title may be considered for a qualified applicant, or they may be filled individually.

The Town Manager is responsible for the efficient administration of the Town and implements the policies and directives of the Town Council. He/she attends all Council meetings and serves as the chief administrative officer, directing the delivery of all services through subordinate department heads. The Town Manager makes recommendations to the Council for new or modified services addressing the health, safety, and/or welfare of the Town's residents. The Town Manager is responsible for the preparation of the town budget, along with periodic operational and financial reports for the Town Council, and administration of grants. Successful candidate should be experienced in municipal governance and management, have excellent communication skills (both written and verbal), be well-versed incurrent technology (including Microsoft Word, Excel and virtual meeting technology), have a knowledge of accounting and municipal finance, and be able to maintain a calm and consistent demeanor.

The Town Clerk is responsible for preparation of meeting agendas and minutes and is expected to attend all Council meetings. The Clerk must assure compliance with all statutory requirements regarding posting and publication of notices as well as with Arizona's Open Meeting Law. The Clerk is responsible for the filing and safekeeping of all town records, and compliance with records retention requirements. He/she serves as a liaison between the governing body, management and public and thus must have excellent communication skills. The Town Clerk also provides administrative support to the Planning and Zoning office and boards as well as to the Manager, serves as Election Official, prepares candidate packets and arranges with the County for ballot preparation. The Clerk also prepares and distributes the Town's bimonthly newsletter. Ideal candidate will have some experience in municipal operations, be well-versed in current technology (including Microsoft Word, Excel and virtual meeting technology), and be able to maintain a calm and consistent demeanor.
