2024 Bulk Item Pick-Up 8-5 to 8-30



Announcing that 2024's annual extra trash pick-up will start Monday, August 5th and go through Friday, August 30th. Jerome's Public Works Department will do a one-time-per-household, single bulk item removal. This means you can put that torn-up recliner or broken vacuum cleaner out with your regular trash and the town crew will whisk it away for you.


Items town crew will **NOT** pick up (transfer station will **NOT** accept):

hazardous waste \varnothing contaminated soil \varnothing tires \varnothing large drums \varnothing medical waste \varnothing wet paint asbestos \varnothing batteries \varnothing railroad ties \varnothing fluorescent light bulbs \varnothing television sets

If your regular trash is picked up on Fridays, then that's the day to set out your extra pick-up. If you are on the Monday route, same drill.

Public Works will run this special service through the month of August OR UNTIL THE DUMPSTER IS FULL! Please keep in mind we are talking about single bulk items, don't empty your whole garage! Not sure of what can or cannot be picked up? Call us at town hall: 928-634-7943.

One more thing: Please bag your loose trash and be mindful of the weight of your regular cans. The town code limit is 40 pounds MAX. Thank you!

JULY NEWSLETTER 2024

We are looking forward to holding the **July 4th parade** once again on Thursday morning, July 4th. We will meet at the Fire Station at 9:30 with the parade to begin around 10:30 a.m. Please be there no later than 10:00 or we cannot guarantee participation. If you are interested in participating in the parade, please contact Chief Blair. All are welcome to participate in the parade or wave from the streets!



The Fire Department hopes that all our residents have a great and safe 4th of July.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT FIREWORKS ARE PROHIBITED IN JEROME AT ALL TIME!

This means sparklers too! Per town code 10-2-2

Yavapai County, the Prescott National Forest and Jerome are all in STAGE I FIRE RESTRICTIONS

What is Prohibited:

- No building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire *except* in Forest Service **developed recreation sites** (not including dispersed camping areas).
- No smoking *except* in an enclosed vehicle or building, or in **specific developed recreation sites**.

What is allowed:

- Petroleum-fueled stoves, lanterns, or heating devices providing such devices meet the fire underwriter's specification for safety.
- The use of commercially manufactured charcoal grills or wood smokers is allowed on private property so long a tight-fitting lid is in place during use and sparks and fire brands are contained within the device. Devices fueled solely by liquid petroleum, LPG, or LNG are always allowed so long as the flame may be immediately extinguished without residual combustion.
- Shooting firearms IS allowed. Just make sure to follow all federal, state & local regulations: No shooting within 150 yards of a campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, residence or building. No shooting across a road, trail or body of water, or in any manner or place whereby any person property is exposed to injury or damage as a result of such discharge. No shooting in a cave.

NOTE-

- Yavapai County prohibits the discharge of firearms during fire restrictions.
- Violating these restrictions in the Prescott National Forest is a violation that carries a <u>mandatory appearance in</u> federal court.

WATER RESTRICTIONS

Article 13-9 of the Jerome Town Code provides that Level 1 water restrictions go into effect automatically as of May 1 each year and continue through September 30, requiring certain water conservation measures. These restrictions are going to remain in effect untill September 30th

The town has been in strategy one since January 12 2023, the requirements of Strategy I - "Water Alert" - have been expanded. Changes are shown in red below.

Continuing until further notice, the Town is operating under "Demand Reduction Strategy I – 'Water Alert.'" Per the Town Code, this strategy mandates the following:

Water shall be conserved both inside and outside the home or business using best practices available to minimize waste. No person shall waste water.

- Outdoor water use shall not occur between the hours of 9 AM to 5 PM. Outdoor water use shall be limited to two hours per day between the hours of 5:00 PM and 9:00 AM.
- Vehicle washing shall only be undertaken with a bucket and hose with a shut off nozzle or other water saving devices such as a pressure washer.
- Cooling outdoor areas with water or misting devices is prohibited.
- Restaurants shall serve water to customers upon request only and shall display table tents or other types of public notice to this effect.
- Construction projects shall use only reclaimed water or effluent or supply their own water for on-site use and dust control.
- Daily water usage is limited to 900 gallons of water per meter unit, per 24-hour period. The only exceptions to this limit are restaurants and hotels with more than four rooms made available for lodging.

Once the need for "Demand Reduction Strategy I" no longer exists, we will immediately post the reverting back to normal operations. Anyone out of compliance with these restrictions may be subject to penalties. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Firewise Activities

Fire danger is Very High. With the lack of moisture in June, please be extra cautious of possible fire activities. Jerome Fire recommends that a defensible space of 30 feet be created around your residence. If any resident needs help from our fuel abatement crew, Firewise applications can be filled out at the Jerome Fire Department, or Jerome Town Hall. On a side note, the burn pile is getting full, and we will soon be shutting it down until we are able to burn the pile.

EIREW/SER

Be mindful to be extra cautious if you are a smoker that you have at least five foot clear of vegetation when smoking and when BBQing.

The Jerome Fire Department is looking into the visibility of Public Addressing. Please help us help you by ensuring your address is clearly visible. You can assist us greatly by having numbers at least 3 inches high, with a high contrast and reflection. Placing numbers at or above the main entrance, clearly visible from the street, and adding secondary numbers if your entrance isn't clear, is a great help in keeping you and your family safe in an emergency.

The Fire Department is always looking for new members for Fire, EMS, and/or both. Free training, cool t-shirts, drive big trucks with red lights. 5 PM, every Thursday. Come on down and see what we do.

MARGE MITCHELL

1929-2024

Marge Mitchell died May 30th at the age of 95. She was born in Columbus, Ohio on April 3rd, 1929, to Alton Mitchell and Nina Graves Mitchell. She graduated from the University of Kentucky cum laude and Mortar Board with a B.S. in Home Economics and Food Sciences. After working for many years in the corporate world of food, Marge and her partner, Joan Sedgwick, opened a restaurant in Middlebury, VT called the Bakery Lane Soup Bowl. They moved to Prescott, AZ in 1978

and opened Maude's, a lunch restaurant. In 1982 they moved Maude's to Jerome, AZ, where it became a dinner restaurant which won acclaim in <u>Family Circle</u>, <u>The L.A. Times</u> and <u>100 Best Restaurants</u> (an Arizona restaurant guide). Marge was a wonderful chef and her family and friends were blessed by the many meals she prepared and shared.

Marge and Joan wrote two cookbooks, "Bakery Lane Soup Bowl," and "Soup Bowl West"; both of which were published by Random House.

Marge was a founding member and recent President of the Jerome Humane Society. Up until a few months prior to her death, she was a dedicated volunteer working in the clinic on a weekly basis as well as serving on the Board of Directors.

Marge was preceded in death by her partner of over 50 years, Joan Sedgwick. She is survived by her nephew, Rick Walburn of New York, NY and his husband Romney Piamonte. She also leaves

behind members of Joan's family who loved her very much, including Tom McCarley, Denise Moretz, Kirby and Michael Hall, Bucky and Mary McCarley, and Nick and Trinity McCarley. She is also survived by her beloved tortoiseshell cat "Mini Cooper."

Marge was blessed with a network of wonderful friends including Mary Wills, Sally Dryer, Ted Stratton, Joyce Richards, Bernie Molaskey, Virginia Kennaway, Tessa Unwin and countless others. She will be truly missed.
