We are opening this opportunity up to residents of Jerome; this is a great time to clean out your desk of those old documents you don't need anymore, but don't want to risk throwing in your regular trash. Bring your documents that you would like to shred to Town Hall, 600 Clark Street on November 16th. This is a first-come first-served event, so please keep that in mind and only bring those items that need to be shredded (see below). Also, please go through your documents and check that they do not contain any hazards (see below). Again, this is first-come first served from 9 AM to Noon or until the truck is full!


