Question:
Do I have to vote every race? Will my ballot be rejected if I did not vote every race?

Answer:
No, you do not have to vote every race. Your ballot will still count for the races you voted.

Question:
Can I drop off my mail ballot on Election Day?

Answer:
Yes, however, this significantly slows down results. If you are going to vote early, then please vote early!

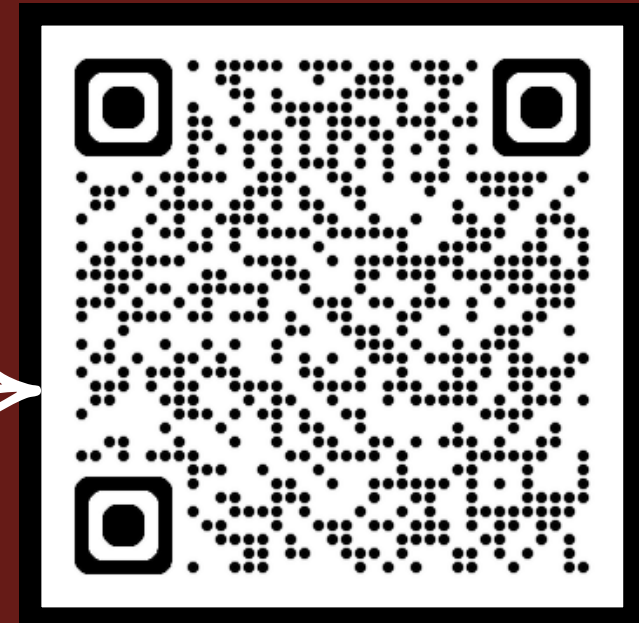
