The time and location of these will be posted on our town web site and Facebook page (thank you



From the Police Chief:

Lately there seems to be some confusion concerning contacting the police, and I would like to clarify the process again.


- 1. If it is an emergency, call 911, if you are unsure, call 911. I would rather you call 911 and err on the side of caution than delay potential critical resources from the scene.
- 2. If it is not an EMERGENCY but you need a police car to respond, or need to speak to an officer within a short period of time, call dispatch at 928-634-2245, that number is manned 24/7, and in the event we don't have an officer on duty, they will call the "on call" officer or me so we can deal with the problem. Please remember, we are not billed for each call to dispatch, we pay a single lump annual sum.
- 3. If you want to leave us a message, want to talk to somebody but time is not critical (remember we can have a day when nobody goes to the office) or provide us with a complaint that is not time sensitive, call our office and if somebody doesn't answer, leave a message. Again, remember the office is not staffed 24/7, and there are periods when it may be a day before somebody checks the answering machine.
- 4. While I do not mind people calling my cell phone (the Town does not pay for my phone), remember if you call me with an emergency, and I am not on duty or in town, I then just have to do what I have stated above in items #1 or #2, this causes significant delays in response. It is not that I personally mind the call, it is just that it interferes with a timely response in an emergency. Please, if the matter is time sensitive, follow the procedure! Any other times you want to call me, please feel free to do so, just understand that I too may be out of town, off duty, or out of cell range.
- 5. Do not call Chief Blair for police matters, because he then has to call me, and I may have to call somebody else, significantly slowing response times.

REMEMBER, if it is a POLICE, FIRE, or MEDICAL EMERGENCY CALL 911! If you are unsure, call 911!

All of our numbers are in the regular phone book, the Jerome phone book, the monthly town newsletter and on the office answering machine.


Burn Pile

Greetings everyone,

I would like to thank everyone who has been supportive of my role here as your new Zoning Administrator. I am enjoying my time with you and the town - I would also like to include my new representation of the town for both Transportation and Hazard Mitigation planning. I am currently working with government entities which will give the Town opportunity for Federal Transportation Grants and other funding as well.

Concerning our wonderful town, please be sure to stop by or call and ask me about any renovations or construction that you deem necessary for your personal projects. If I can help you reach your personal goals in town, I will, of course, through due process and the law. As I mentioned, I have been adapting to the town quite well and will be walking around frequently to get the best picture I can for the town. This helps me understand what fits in well with Jerome and also gives me an idea of what not to do. Awareness of our historic image is very important and we should all be concerned with the decisions we make for changes on that image. Concerning historic homes, it is important for me to review each project based not only on historic design standards, but also by blending your individual right to protect and maintain your property. There are times when design may have to give way to safety requirements. Such might apply to replacing railings, stairways, porches or decks as an example. Always remember to consider and discuss building safety requirements with the building inspector.

Finally, I will be making trips around town dealing with business licensing - if you have a new business, of course you will need to apply for a license and just as well, if your license is up for renewal you will need to apply for that. I work closely with the Fire Chief and the Building Inspector signing off on a business license. I look for change of use, sign changes or other display issues and for new licensing, I look for things like a change in floor plans, a change in use from the previous business, parking, and obviously signage for the new business, which will require a separate application for sign approval through the Design Review Board. They are for your benefit to ensure that all businesses are in compliance with the zoning ordinance.

As always, my door is open and I welcome your stopping in to say hi or to help you with your needs.

Jerome Public Library


If you grew up in the 1950's like I did, one of the treats was a new copy of *Life* or *Look* magazine. I was thrilled to see all the bound volumes of magazines in The Old Book Room. The first magazine was published in Germany in 1663. The British published *The Gentleman's Magazine* in 1731. In 1850 *Harpers* was first published in the U.S. Today it is the second oldest magazine in the America. In 1862, the English published *London Society*, light and amusing literature for the hours of relaxation, and it was richly illustrated. We have 15 beautiful volumes of *London Society* from 1862 till 1880. Their leather bindings are a bit worn, their gold leaf a little faded, but they are treasures!

You know you're having a bad day when you look in the mirror and see those flashing red lights. That is what many call an "Oh Crap" moment. The Officer approaches the vehicle and you keep your hands on the steering wheel or in plain sight. "License, registration and insurance," he/she says.

You look for your registration and insurance card. You can't find it. Why? Because there's too much stuff in there. The Officer will give you a minute to locate it, but if you cannot, you will be cited with No Proof of Insurance (ARS 28-4135) and No Proof of Registration (ARS 28-2158).

But now you think....no big deal. I know I'm insured and my plates have the proper sticker on it. Not a problem!!! THINK AGAIN!!! The law requires you to have evidence within the motor vehicle of current financial responsibility. Failure to do so results in a violation. And the penalty is a fine of no less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) PLUS fees and surcharges of \$450 on top of that! AND Arizona Motor Vehicle Department will suspend the driver's license of the person driving and the registration and license plates of the motor vehicle involved for THREE (3) months. If this happens again within a 36 month period, the fine goes up and so does the suspension of license and registration.

If you have proof of insurance, honor your promise to appear in Court for the date cited and show the Court your proof. If you have proof of coverage on the date of the violation, the Court can dismiss that charge.

If someone else was driving your vehicle and they got the ticket for No Proof of Insurance, your license plates will still be suspended for no less than three months if that person fails to show up for their court date.

The registration, however, is another matter. The law requires the registration card to be carried in the "driver's compartment of the vehicle." Upon presentation of registration to the Court, the Court can reduce the fine.

And if you are borrowing someone else's car, make sure the proof of insurance is in the vehicle and their registration tag on the license plate is current. That's your responsibility as the driver!
