WATER RESTRICTIONS SUSPENDED

The Town Code provides that Level 1 water restrictions go into effect automatically as of May 1 each year, requiring certain water conservation measures; however, in light of our current healthy water flows, in consultation with the Fire Chief and Public Works department, I have suspended those restrictions until further notice. We will closely monitor the flows and water levels in our tanks, and if mandatory restrictions become necessary, a notice will be posted at our posting locations, on the Town's website and Facebook page, and delivered to each address.

However, ... in order to avoid the need to place mandatory restrictions on our water use, residents are strongly encouraged to conserve water to the greatest extent possible.

Thank you. If everyone does their part, and the weather cooperates, we may be able to get through this season without the need for mandatory restrictions.

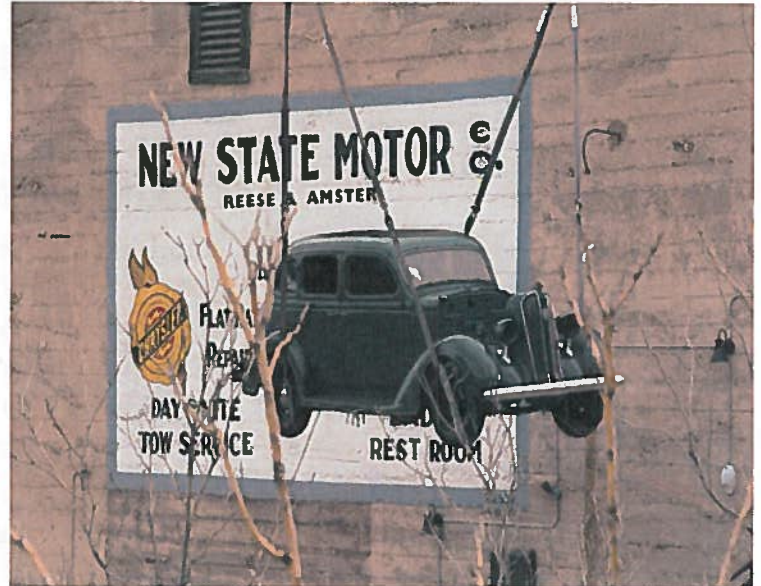

Did you know.....that the New State Motor Company was originally equipped with a car elevator? The New State Motor Company Building was built in 1917. Originally it was a three-story reinforced concrete building with the capacity for 650 cars. There was a machine shop and garage as well as an interior elevator to raise and lower cars. Around 1927 a wooden ramp was built to take cars from Main Street to the second floor. The ramp was removed in the late 1930s.

CONTEMPLATIONS FROM COUNCILMEMBER BACHRACH

Friends, Jeromans, countrymen, lend me your ear. What follows are some random thoughts that I'd like to share with you and ask you to think about.

No.1: ELECTION. As you may know, we have a town election coming up this summer. If you would like to play a part in the shaping of the future of Jerome, or put another way, would like to help drive this bus to the madhouse, please consider running for a position on the Town Council. It's a big commitment, and not to be taken lightly, but if elected, you will, no doubt, be making history as many have done before us. Play a part, give back to the community and help preserve the character and quality of life of our beloved town. Candidate packets are available from Rosa at the Town Hall front desk.

No.2: HOTEL JEROME. The new roof installation on the Hotel Jerome and the associated drainage system is complete. We are very pleased with the results. The roof was a substantial investment, but the costs were covered by the USDA grant we received and a generous donation from the Jerome Artist's Cooperative. Now, if it would just rain once again, we could all marvel at how dry the cooperative manager's office is.

As we continue the stabilization of the Hotel Jerome, the next step will be to empty all rooms on the second, third and fourth floors in preparation for the remediation of lead-based paint. The paint on every wall tested positive for high lead content and must be dealt with accordingly. There is a lot of “stuff” on the second floor (the floor above the Artists Cooperative). Much of it looks like personal items, and it appears to have been abandoned. If you are storing items on this floor, or know someone who is, please be aware that after June 15th it will all be headed to the dumpster.

No.3: DRONES! Trespassing or an invasion of privacy by drones and their users isn't very prevalent in Jerome, but there have been reports of drones hovering closely over residents' homes. As a town, we are prohibited by state statute from “regulating” the use of drones. That said, drones are required to fly no lower than 80 feet at all times. If you feel that your privacy is being invaded do not hesitate to call the police so that they can discuss the matter with the drone operator. We will be discussing the issue of drones at the regular Town Council meeting on May 8th. Please come to provide input and suggestions.

No.4: FIRE! OK, listen, Stage 1 fire restrictions are in effect as of April 20th in the Prescott National Forest. This was the driest winter in Arizona in over 100 years. Please obey fire restriction rules and be alert for anyone who is not as careful.

No.5: WATER! Unless we get some serious rain here before the monsoons start, we may be looking at water conservation measures again soon. We are in a severe drought and have been for years. Please be mindful of your selection for outdoor plants and consider native plants that are accustomed to our dry climate. Also, please keep an eye out for leaks, drips and improvement opportunities or repairs that would help conserve water.

Thanks to everyone for their public input at the Town Council meetings.

Firehouse Subs Grant We applied for a grant from Firehouse Subs after finding out our department was close enough to the location in Prescott Valley. We received an email on April 3rd and we are pleased to announce that the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation Board of Directors has awarded the Jerome Fire Department a grant for our request of five sets of Innotex Custom Bunker Gear (helmets, firefighter gloves, Nomex Hoods, Black Diamond Boots, Glove Straps and flashlights) valued at up to \$16,801.05. Measurements have already been taken, the gear has been ordered and we expect to see the Innotex Custom Bunker Gear in about 9 weeks.

Firewise Community Day Saturday, May 5th We hope to see you Saturday May 5th for our Firewise Community Day from 10 to 2 at the Fire Station. There will be a clown to educate and entertain the kids and Jerome's own Ukulele Orchestra will perform. Drop by, learn how you can help protect your property and your neighborhood! We'll even cook up a hamburger or hot dog for you.

Speaking of Weather As we all know moisture levels are very low and predicted to be low for the near future. We are already in fire restrictions and will be continuing our Firewise efforts while keeping a close eye on moisture levels and winds. We are hoping for an active monsoon season, but we have heard no predictions yet. Our biggest fear is "dry lightning," which is lightning with no rain during monsoon season. As always, be careful with fire!

Please Note the Stage 1 Fire Restrictions:

- Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, or wood stove other than in a developed campsite or picnic area is prohibited. Exemptions include persons using a device solely fueled by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels that can be turned on and off. Such devices can only be used in an area that is barren or cleared of all overhead and surrounding flammable materials within three feet of the device.
- Smoking is prohibited unless it is within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site/improved site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.
- The discharging or use of any kind of fireworks or incendiary devices is prohibited.
- Welding or operating acetylene or other torch device with an open flame is prohibited.

The Fire Department is always looking for new members for fire, EMS, and/or both. Free training, cool t-shirts and drive big trucks with red lights. 5 PM, every Thursday. Come on down and see what we do. Everybody is welcome.

If the fire and EMS doesn't interest you, but you would still like to help out, the Jerome Fire Department Auxiliary is always welcoming new members as well!! Come join us!!

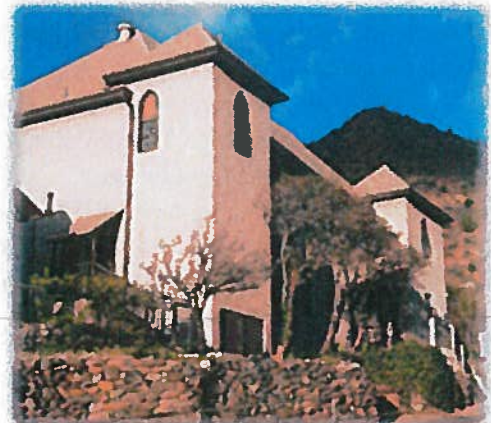
Dear Jerome Friends:

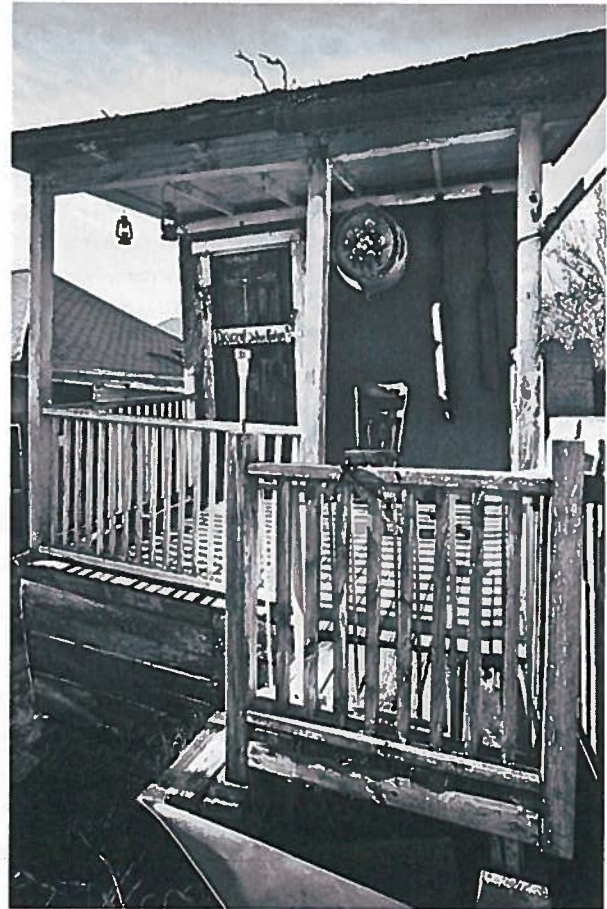

Jerome Public Library

Perhaps you've heard the expression, "If it can't be grown, it has to be mined." Unless it's a plant or an animal, it came from inside the earth. Each American uses about 47,500 pounds of newly mined minerals annually. What does this have to do with the Old Book Room? I had a visitor from Butte, Montana (one home of Copper Baron William Clark) who was very interested in Jerome's mining history. I recommended all the local establishments that specialize in those Boomtown days. Then I showed him around the Old Book Room where we have unique copper-centric items that he wasn't going to see elsewhere. Vintage volumes of the illustrated "Transactions of the American Institute of Mining Engineers" plus "Principles of Copper Smelting," "Handbook for Prospectors," "WPS/Output per man in Copper Mining," "Manual of Assaying (1894)," "Interviews with Mining Engineers" and dozens of early 20th Century pamphlets from the US Department of the Interior, Department of Commerce and the American Institute of Mining and Metallurgical Engineers. We display historic Jerome photos, artwork and maps that I hadn't seen before. So, if you or someone you know is interested in our town's subterranean roots, stop by the Old Book Room and let's see what we can "dig up."

NOTICE:

THE JEROME POLICE DEPARTMENT IS CURRENTLY WORKING ON THE RESIDENTIAL PARKING ORDINANCE ROLLOUT (ARTICLE 12-2 OF THE TOWN CODE – **RESIDENTIAL PARKING**). STREETS AFFECTED BY THE ORDINANCE ARE: *COUNTY ROAD, SCHOOL STREET, CENTER STREET, FIRST STREET (BETWEEN VERDE AVE AND CENTER STREET), SECOND STREET (BETWEEN VERDE AVE AND CENTER STREET), THIRD STREET (BETWEEN VERDE AVE AND CENTER STREET), FOURTH STREET (BETWEEN VERDE AVE AND CENTER STREET), FIFTH STREET (BETWEEN VERDE AVE AND CENTER STREET), HULL ROAD, VERDE AVENUE, HOLLY STREET AND EAST AVENUE.*

NOTE: IF YOUR STREET IS NOT LISTED, OR YOU PARK COMPLETELY ON PRIVATE PROPERTY, YOU DO NOT NEED TO SECURE A PERMIT AND CAN DISREGARD THIS NOTICE.

EACH RECOGNIZED DWELLING UNIT LOCATED WITHIN THE RESIDENTIAL PARKING AREAS DESCRIBED ABOVE WILL BE GRANTED ONE FREE VEHICLE PARKING PERMIT (UPON PROVIDING PROPERLY COMPLETED APPLICATION TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT), SO THAT THE VEHICLE DISPLAYING THE PERMIT MAY PARK ON THE PUBLIC STREET IN THAT AREA. IF THE NUMBER OF AVAILABLE PUBLIC PARKING SPACES WITHIN A SPECIFIC RESIDENTIAL PARKING AREA PROVIDE FOR IT, A SECOND PERMIT MAY BE REQUESTED FOR A SECOND VEHICLE. IF THE NUMBER OF REQUESTED PERMITS EXCEEDS THE AVAILABLE PUBLIC PARKING SPACES IN A GIVEN AREA, A LOTTERY WILL BE CONDUCTED ANNUALLY FOR THOSE PERMITS.

LOTTERY: IN THE EVENT APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED EXCEED THE NUMBER OF AVAILABLE SPACES FOR A STREET, A LOTTERY WILL BE CONDUCTED. APPLICANTS WILL BE NOTIFIED AHEAD OF TIME.

WE EXPECT TO HAVE THE ORDINANCE FULLY IMPLEMENTED BY **JUNE 1, 2018**. IN ORDER TO FACILITATE THE ROLLOUT, WE WILL BEGIN ACCEPTING PARKING PERMIT APPLICATIONS ON **MAY 1, 2018**. APPLICATIONS CAN BE PICKED UP AT TOWN HALL OR THE JEROME POLICE DEPARTMENT OR DOWNLOADED FROM THE TOWN WEBSITE (WWW.JEROME.AZ.GOV/; UNDER FORMS AND DOCUMENTS). WE WOULD LIKE TO ASK THAT APPLICATIONS AND SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION BE SUBMITTED TO THE JEROME POLICE DEPARTMENT BY **MAY 15, 2018**. APPLICATIONS WILL BE VALIDATED FOR ELIGIBILITY. PLEASE INCLUDE A COPY OF A CURRENT UTILITY BILL AND APPLICABLE VEHICLE REGISTRATION WITH YOUR PERMIT APPLICATION.

PLEASE NOTE: IF YOU HAVE A DWELLING UNIT THAT REQUIRES, OR REQUIRED, ONSITE PARKING, YOU WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR FREE ON STREET PARKING PERMIT(S). DWELLING UNITS THAT HAVE A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT REQUIRING ONSITE PARKING WILL BE VERIFIED FOR ELIGIBILITY THROUGH THE JEROME ZONING ADMINISTRATOR.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE SPIRIT OF THE LAW IS TO CONTROL THE NUMBER OF VEHICLES PARKED ON PUBLIC STREETS AND ALLOW RESIDENTS MORE ACCESSIBILITY TO STREET PARKING NEAR THEIR PROPERTY. OUR GOAL IS NOT TO WRITE TICKETS, BUT TO ALLOW FOR THE FAIR USAGE OF PUBLIC STREET PARKING. EXCEPT FOR TOURIST PARKING IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS, WE WILL BE ENFORCING THIS ORDINANCE ON A COMPLAINT BY COMPLAINT BASIS.

TEMPORARY PERMITS: PER TOWN CODE, SECTION 12-2-8, TEMPORARY PERMITS ARE FOR USE BY A VISITOR TO A RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY WITHIN A PERMIT ONLY AREA. A TEMPORARY PERMIT WILL BE PLACED ON THE DASH OF THE VEHICLE CLEARLY VISIBLE FROM THE OUTSIDE BY ANY PERSON WHO MAY WALK BY. TEMPORARY PERMITS WILL BE VALID FOR SEVEN (7) DAYS. THERE SHALL BE NO FEE FOR TEMPORARY PERMITS. PLEASE NOTIFY THE JEROME POLICE DEPARTMENT BY TELEPHONE OR EMAIL THAT A TEMPORARY PERMIT IS IN USE.
