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ORDINANCE NO. 381

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA, AMENDING ARTICLE 16-1, "DEFINITIONS," OF CHAPTER 16, "VINEYARDS," OF THE JEROME TOWN CODE REGARDING THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF VINES WHICH SHALL CONSTITUTE VINICULTURE

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2010, the Mayor and Council adopted Ordinance No. 380, which amended the Jerome Zoning Ordinance to add viniculture as a Conditional Use in the AR zone; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance provided that plantings of fewer than 100 vines shall not constitute viniculture; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend Article 16-1, "Definitions," of Chapter 16, "Vineyards," of the Jerome Town Code to be consistent with the provisions of Ordinance No. 380;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Jerome, Yavapai County, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1. Article 16-1, "Definitions," of Chapter 16, "Vineyards," of the Jerome Town Code is hereby amended as follows (additions in **bold underline**; deletions in ~~strikeout text~~):

ARTICLE 16-1. Definitions.

Section 16-1-1. Definitions.

For the purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

"Vineyard" is an area of land planted with cultivated grapevines.

"Viniculture" is the science, cultivation and study of grapes which deals with the series of events that occur in a vineyard, which vineyard produces grapes specifically for winemaking, whether for commercial, non-commercial or domestic use. The term "viniculture" shall not apply to plantings of ~~twenty (20)~~ **one hundred (100)** vines or less.

"Parcel" is any area of land with ~~twenty (20)~~ **one hundred (100)** or more grapevines, up to one-half acre.

"Irrigation" or "Irrigate"- the artificial application of water, whether delivered by the Town or other sources, to the soil for assisting in growing crops.

Section 2. Following its adoption, this ordinance shall be published by the Town Clerk in accordance with the requirements of A.R.S. 39-203 *et seq.*

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency herewith.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after final adoption, as provided by law.
