

TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 105 $\frac{1}{2}$

THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME ^{ORDINANCE} ~~DO~~ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to throw or allow to be thrown or to be deposited in the public sewers, man-holes, flush tanks, or in any vessel or receptacle connected with the public sewers, any garbage, hair, flowers, fruits, ashes, vegetables, refuse, cloth, cinders, or any solid substance or matter whatever, except toilet paper.

Section 2. On and after the first day of May 1919, all toilets must be equipped with the regulation traps the bowls used to be either of the syphon or wash down type.

Section 3. Every fixture hereinafter used in connection with the said bowls must be properly vented. It shall be the duty of every plumber installing fixtures to promptly report to the Health Officer of said Town, all work installed.

Every person violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction be fined in any sum of not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the Town jail not less than five days or more than sixty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

WHEREAS, in order to protect the public health, peace and safety of the inhabitants of said town, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance is hereby exempted from the referendum provision of the constitution and laws of the State of Arizona, and the same shall be in force after its passage and publication.
