

TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 116

THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation, or any driver having control of any motor vehicle, used in the transportation of passengers in or out of Jerome, for hire, to allow more than two such motor vehicles for each owner thereof, to be parked upon the business section of Main street, at any one time.

Section 2. Any person, firm, association or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction, be fined in any sum, not less than \$10 nor more than \$100, or be imprisoned in the town Jail for not less than five days nor more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. WHEREAS, owing to the unregulated parking of automobiles and the consequent congestion and unsettled conditions of Main Street, which constitute a menace to the peace and safety to the people thereof, it is necessary that this ordinance become immediately operative; and it is hereby declared exempt of the referendum provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Arizona, and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.
