

TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 120

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES
ON THE PUBLIC STREETS WITHIN THE TOWN OF
JEROME, WITHIN CERTAIN LIMITS AND
PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE
VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, at any time, to hitch or stand or to leave hitched or standing or to cause or permit to stand or be left hitched or standing, any animal, or to stand or to leave standing or to cause or permit to stand or be left standing, any vehicle, upon the streets of Jerome within the following described limits: for the entire width of the streets designated.

Beginning at a line across Clark Street from the northeast corner of the U.V. Apartment House to the northwest corner of the Con O'Keefe building, thence northerly along Clark Street to the intersection with the road to the 300-foot level of the United Verde mine. All of the area of this intersection. Thence southerly along the road to the 300-foot level of the United Verde mine to it's intersection with Main Street. All of the area of this intersection; and that portion of Main Street from the northwest corner of the New State garage to a line at right angles across the street from the northeast corner of the T.F. Miller Co. building.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars or by imprisonment in the town jail not exceeding twenty-five (25) days or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and posting as required by law.
