

ORDINANCE NO. 137.

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA, THE PROPOSITION OF USING THE SUM OF \$30,000.00 HERETOFORE VOTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME FOR USE IN CONSTRUCTING A COMBINED TOWN HALL, JAIL AND FIRE DEPARTMENT, FOR THE PURPOSE OF REMODELING THE PRESENT TOWN HALL AND RETIRING OUTSTANDING BONDS.

THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a Special Municipal election is hereby called to be held in the Town of Jerome, Yavapai County, Arizona, on the 11th day of September, 1928.

Section 2. That at said election those property taxpayers, who in all other respects are qualified electors of the Town of Jerome, shall be the only persons entitled to vote.

Section 3. That said election shall be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Arizona, in relation thereto and the following proposition shall be submitted to the above described electors thereat:

"That the sum of \$30,000.00 Thirty thousand Dollars heretofore obtained by the said Town of Jerome, through the bond issue provided for in Ordinances No. 101 and 105, for the purpose of constructing a combined Town Hall, Town Jail and Fire Department, shall be expended by the Town Council of the Town of Jerome, in the following manner and not as provided by the terms of said bond issue, to-wit: the sum of, not to exceed seven thousand (\$7,000.00) Dollars, of the said sum of Thirty thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, shall be expended, by the Town Council of the Town of Jerome, for the purpose of building an addition to the present Town Hall and renovating the same, and the remainder of said fund shall be used, to the full extent thereof, by the said Council, for the purpose of redeeming the bonds heretofore voted by the electors of said Town as said bonds shall hereafter become due."
