## ORDINANCE NO. 140. AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATION AND PARKING OF VEHICLES.

Be it ordsized by the Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Jerome, as follows:

Section 1. That from and after the passage and adoption of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked, upon any of the public streets or avenues in the corporate limits of the Town of Jerome, except in compliance with the terms of this ordinance.

Section 2. It shall be unlewful to park any vehicle upon any of the following named streats or avenues in the Town of Jerume, subject however to the limitations of Section 4 hereof, to-wit: Magnolia Avenue; Giroux Street; the area in the rear of and to the West of, the United Verde Apartments; Main Street, from the intersection of School Street, at the store of the Miner's Furniture and Hardware Company, South to the Town Limits; Main Street from the intersection of Clark Street, at the Hampton House, North to the Town Limits; Genter Street; Verde Avenue; Hospital Read, from the intersection of Clark Street at the Episcopal Church, South to the United Verde Hospital; Hull Avenue, from Jerome Avenue North to the Town Limits.

Section 5. Perking shall be permitted hereefter, subject to the limitations of Section 4 hereof, on the following named streets and evenues on one side thereof as hereinefter designated, to-wit: Clark Street on the Rest side thereof; First Street on the South side thereof; Jerome Avenue on the South side thereof; School Street, from the intersection of Main Street at the store of the Miner's Furniture & Hardwere Company to Center Street at Tutt's store, on the East and North sides thereof; Hull Avenue, from the intersection of Main Street, to the intersection of

Jerome Avenue, on the Best side thereof; Main Street, from the intersection of Jerome Avenue to the intersection of School Street, at the store of the Miner's Parniture & Hardware Company, perking shall be permitted on both sides thereof for a period of not to exceed 45 minutes between the hours of 8 A. M. and 6:50 P. M.

Section 4. It shall be lawful however to park any vehicle at any point designated by the Police Department of the Town of Jerome as a parking area on any of the feregoing described atreets or avenues set forth in Sections 2 and 3 hereof, where a sign has been placed by said department with the words inscribed thereof, "Park Here". It shall however be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked any vehicle on any of the streets or avenues described in Section 3 hereof at any point at which the Police Department of the Town of Jerome has placed a sign with the words inscribed thereon "No Parking".

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to meddle with, tamper with, remove or destroy any barricade or obstruction placed upon or seroes any street or avenue in the Town of Jerome, while the same or any pert therefor, is under construction or repeig; and it shall be unlawful to drive any vehicle upon or scross any such street when the same has been barricaded to stop traffic thereupon for the purpose of constructing or repairing the same.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to fail or refuse to bring the same to a complete stop before entering any intersection at which there has been placed, by the Pelice Department of the Town of Jerome, a sign

with the word "Stop", inscribed thereon.

Section 7. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or cause to be parked, any vehicle, in front of any private garage or private driveway.

Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to mutilate or destroy any traffic sign placed upon any of the public streets or avenues of the Town of Jerome, by the Police Department thereof.

Section 9. It shell be unlawful for any person to operate any motor vehicle inside the limits of the Town of Jerome, without the exhaust from the motor thereof being effectively muffled.

Section 10. It shell be unlawful for any person to operate a vehicle upon any of the public streets or evenues of the Town of Jerome, insuch a manner as to endanger the lives or safety of other persons or vehicles upon said street or evenue.

Section 11. It shall be unlewful for any person to operate any motor vehicle, other than a metercycle, road roller, road machinery or form treator, in the Town of Jerome, during the period from one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sun rise, unless the same shall be equipped with two head lamps and no more, showing a white light of sufficient strength to make a person clearly discernible at a distance of seventy-five feet under normal streagheric conditions and a rear lamp showing a red light which shall be clearly visible at a distance of five hundred feet under normal atmospheric conditions; every motor cycle shall be equipped with one and not more than two head lamps

showing a white light of sufficient strength to make a person clearly visible at a distance of seventy-five feet and a rear lamp showing a red light which can clearly be seen at a distance of five hundred (500) feet, under normal atmospheric conditions, and said lamps shell be lighted when such motor eyele is being operated inside the limits of the Town of Jerome, during the period of, from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.

Section 18. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any of the public streets or evenues of the Town of Jerome at a speed greater than fifteen (15) miles per hour.

Section 13. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of the feregoing ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum of not less than Two (\$2.00) Dellars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dellars, or be imprisoned in the Twom Jail of the Town of Jerome, for a period of not more than three (5) menths, or by both such fine and imprisonent.

Section 14. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby reposled.

Insamuch as this ordinance is necessary and requires an early operation to preserve the public health and selety of the inhabitants of the Town of Jerome, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, and the same is hereby exemp ted from the referendum provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Arisons.
