

ORDINANCE NO. 140.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATION AND PARKING OF VEHICLES.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Jerome, as follows:

Section 1. That from and after the passage and adoption of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked, upon any of the public streets or avenues in the corporate limits of the Town of Jerome, except in compliance with the terms of this ordinance.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle upon any of the following named streets or avenues in the Town of Jerome, subject however to the limitations of Section 4 hereof, to-wit: Magnolia Avenue; Giroux Street; the area in the rear of and to the West of, the United Verde Apartments; Main Street, from the intersection of School Street, at the store of the Miner's Furniture and Hardware Company, South to the Town Limits; Main Street from the intersection of Clark Street, at the Hampton House, North to the Town Limits; Center Street; Verde Avenue; Hospital Road, from the intersection of Clark Street at the Episcopal Church, South to the United Verde Hospital; Hull Avenue, from Jerome Avenue North to the Town Limits.

Section 3. Parking shall be permitted hereafter, subject to the limitations of Section 4 hereof, on the following named streets and avenues on one side thereof as hereinafter designated, to-wit: Clark Street on the East side thereof; First Street on the South side thereof; Jerome Avenue on the South side thereof; School Street, from the intersection of Main Street at the store of the Miner's Furniture & Hardware Company to Center Street at Tutt's store, on the East and North sides thereof; Hull Avenue, from the intersection of Main Street North to the intersection of

Jerome Avenue, on the East side thereof; Main Street, from the intersection of Jerome Avenue to the intersection of School Street, at the store of the Miner's Furniture & Hardware Company, parking shall be permitted on both sides thereof for a period of not to exceed 45 minutes between the hours of 8 A. M. and 6:30 P. M.

Section 4. It shall be lawful however to park any vehicle at any point designated by the Police Department of the Town of Jerome as a parking area on any of the foregoing described streets or avenues set forth in Sections 2 and 3 hereof, where a sign has been placed by said department with the words inscribed thereon, "Park Here". It shall however be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked any vehicle on any of the streets or avenues described in Section 3 hereof at any point at which the Police Department of the Town of Jerome has placed a sign with the words inscribed thereon "No Parking".

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to meddle with, tamper with, remove or destroy any barricade or obstruction placed upon or across any street or avenue in the Town of Jerome, while the same or any part thereof, is under construction or repair; and it shall be unlawful to drive any vehicle upon or across any such street when the same has been barricaded to stop traffic thereupon for the purpose of constructing or repairing the same.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to fail or refuse to bring the same to a complete stop before entering any intersection at which there has been placed, by the Police Department of the Town of Jerome, a sign

with the word "Stop", inscribed thereon.

Section 7. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or cause to be parked, any vehicle, in front of any private garage or private driveway.

Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to mutilate or destroy any traffic sign placed upon any of the public streets or avenues of the Town of Jerome, by the Police Department thereof.

Section 9. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motor vehicle inside the limits of the Town of Jerome, without the exhaust from the motor thereof being effectively muffled.

Section 10. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a vehicle upon any of the public streets or avenues of the Town of Jerome, in such a manner as to endanger the lives or safety of other persons or vehicles upon said street or avenue.

Section 11. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, road roller, road machinery or farm tractor, in the Town of Jerome, during the period from one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sunrise, unless the same shall be equipped with two head lamps and no more, showing a white light of sufficient strength to make a person clearly discernible at a distance of seventy-five feet under normal atmospheric conditions and a rear lamp showing a red light which shall be clearly visible at a distance of five hundred feet under normal atmospheric conditions; every motor cycle shall be equipped with one and not more than two head lamps

showing a white light of sufficient strength to make a person clearly visible at a distance of seventy-five feet and a rear lamp showing a red light which can clearly be seen at a distance of five hundred (500) feet, under normal atmospheric conditions, and said lamps shall be lighted when such motor cycle is being operated inside the limits of the Town of Jerome, during the period of, from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.

Section 12. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any of the public streets or avenues of the Town of Jerome at a speed greater than fifteen (15) miles per hour.

Section 13. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of the foregoing ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum of not less than Two (\$2.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, or be imprisoned in the Town Jail of the Town of Jerome, for a period of not more than three (3) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 14. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary and requires an early operation to preserve the public health and safety of the inhabitants of the Town of Jerome, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, and the same is hereby exempted from the referendum provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Arizona.
