

ORDINANCE NO. 172

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA ADOPTING THE DISCHARGE AND CARRYING FIREARMS AND GUNS, CODE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA BY REFERENCE, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Section 10-1-23 Discharge and Carrying Firearms and Guns.


It shall be unlawful for any person, except a law officer in the discharge of his duty, to fire or discharge any firearm, rifle, spring or air gun of any discription within the Town, or have any such weapon in his possession or under his control unless it is unloaded. Nothing herein shall be construed as prohibiting the Common Council from authorizing pistol ranges or shooting galleries or as prohibiting the Chief of Police from issuing permits to owners or occupants of private premises to hunt or shoot on such premises.

Whereas the immediate operation of the provisions of this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public pease, health and safety of the Town of Jerome, an EMERGENCY is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Jerome and it is hereby exempt from the referendum provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Arizona.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Jerome, Arizona, this 14th day of January, 1976.
