

ORDINANCE NO. 173

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA ADOPTING THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA OF RESISTING AN OFFICER, BY REFERENCE, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Section 10-1-24 Resisting an Officer

It shall be unlawful for any person to resist, obstruct, or in anyway interfere with any officer of the Town while such officer is doing any act in his official capacity and with lawful authority.

Whereas the immediate operation of the provisions of this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Town of Jerome, an EMERGENCY is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Jerome and it is hereby exempt from the referendum provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Arizona.
