

ORDINANCE NO. 176

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA, ADOPTING THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE AS THE TOWN FIRE CODE AND AMENDING ARTICLE 4-3 OF SAID FIRE CODE, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA:


Section 1: That certain document entitled "Uniform Fire Code", 1976 edition, be adopted.

Section 2: That Article 4-3 of the Town Code be amended to read: "That certain code entitled "Uniform Fire Code", 1976 edition, is hereby adopted as the "Uniform Fire Code of the Town of Jerome", and made a part of this chapter the same as through said code was specifically set forth in full herein; and, at least three copies of said code shall be filed in the office of the Clerk and kept available for public use and inspection."


Section 3: Whereas, it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town of Jerome, Arizona, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall become immediately operative and in force from and after the date of posting hereof.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Jerome, Arizona, this 10th day of May, 1977.
