## ORDINANCE NO. 221

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA, AMENDING SECTION 10-1-12 OF THE TOWN CODE OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA BY CHANGING THE CURFEW FOR MINORS WITHIN THE TOWN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA:

Section 10-1-12 of the Town Code of the Town of Jerome is hereby amended to read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen years old to idle or loiter upon the streets or public places of the town between the hours of ten o'clock p.m. and five o'clock a.m. unless such person is accompanied by a parent, guardian or some person of lawful age having legal custody of the minor. Except, however, employed minors thirteen years of age or older shall have a curfew of twelve o'clock mid-night on weekends, if necessary, as dictated by the demands of their employment. (For purposes of this ordinance "weekends" are herein defined as Friday and Saturday).

It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian, or other adult having the care and custody of such person to encourage or allow such person to idle or loiter upon the streets or public places between the hours of ten o'clock p.m. and five o'clock a.m. unless accompanied by such parent or guardian.

This ordinance does not apply to and is not intended to impede the normal passage of minor persons through town or while on errands undertaken at the direction of his or her parent or guardian, or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor.

Section 10-1-12 of the Town Code of the Town of Jerome is hereby amended to read as follows:
It shall be unlawful for any person under the the age of eighteen years old to idle or loiter upon the streets or public places of the town between the hours of ten o'clock p.m. and five o'clock a.m. unless such person is accompanied by a parent, guardian, or some person of lawful age having legal custody of the minor. Except, however, employed, minors thinteen years of age or older shall have a curfew of twelve o'clock mid-night on weekends, if necessary, as dictated by the demands of their emnecessary, as dictated by the demands of their em-ployment. It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian, or other adult having the care and custody of such person to encourage or allow such person to idle or loiter upon the streets or public places between the house of sen o'clock p.m. and five o'clock a.m. un-

This ordinance does not apply to and is not in-tended to impede the normal passage of minor pa-sons through town or while on enrands undertaken at the direction of his or her parent or guardian, or other adult person having the care and custody of
