

TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 42

Providing for the collection of Street Tax.

THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. An annual street tax of two dollars is hereby levied on each and every male inhabitant over twenty-one years of age and under fifty years of age residing within the corporate limits of the Town of Jerome, for the year of 1907, and each year thereafter.

Section 2. The Marshall shall give at least five days notice in writing, by mail or to be delivered to each person resident of the Town, subject to a street tax, to appear on the day and place named in said notice, and make payment of said street tax, required by section one of this ordinance, and any person thus ~~not~~ notified who shall fail to make payment as above provided shall be considered a delinquent and shall be proceeded against as such, and the Marshall shall proceed to collect of him by civil action in the Justice court the sum of Two Dollars, together with the costs of suit.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force upon its passage and posting.
