

TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 46

REGULATING THE HITCHING OF TEAMS ON STREETS OF JEROME

THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. If any person shall leave any saddlehorse, except those engaged in active delivery work, without the same being securely fastened, or shall leave any horse, horses or any other animals attached to any carriage, wagon or other vehicle in any street, avenue, alley or lane within the corporate limits of the the Town of Jerome, without securely fastening the same, to a post or rack, or without the same being fastened by a chain, rope or halter, from the neck or head to a metal weight upon the ground, such weight weighing at least 15 pounds for a single horse and 25 pounds for a team, ever such person shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in the sum of not less than ten (10.00) dollars and not more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and publication by law.
