

TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 63

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A POLICE COURT IN AND FOR THE TOWN OF JEROME, ARIZONA PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A POLICE JUDGE, AND FIXING HIS COMPENSATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JEROME;

Section 1. That in pursuance of the provisions of an act of the Twenty-Fifth Legislature Assembly of the Territory of Arizona, entitled, "AN act conferring a certain Jurisdiction upon Justices of the Peace and providing for the Establishment of Police Courts in Cities and in Towns and the Procedure for Enforcement of Ordinances", there be and there is here by established a Police Court in and for the Town of Jerome, Yavapai County, State of Arizona.

Section 2. That upon the taking effect of this ordinance, there shall be appointed by the Common Council of said Town, a Police Judge of such Court, who shall hold office during the pleasure of said Council.

Section 3. That the compensation of said Police Judge is hereby fixed at Seventy-five dollars per month.

Section 4. Said Police Judge shall keep a docket to be furnished by the Town, in the same manner as dockets are now required by law to be kept by Justices of the Peace, and said Police Judge shall make monthly reports to the Council of all fines imposed and collected, and of all sentences of imprisonment imposed, and the term and nature thereof.

Section 5. The Common Council shall provide a suitable place for a courtroom for said police court.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.
