It's great to be meeting all the colorful and kind people who live here and love this town and all of its quirks. Now I see from this firsthand perspective at town hall that Jerome, like anyplace, requires a bit of order and honest investment from the community. It's one of the many ways we can keep this a viable place to live.

Okay, so a few things I've learned that may interest you, too:

- When you rent or buy a home in Jerome, you need to open a new utilities account at town hall. That is, if utilities aren't already included in the rent. Check with your landlord to be sure.
- If the number of people living in a household changes, the town counts on its residents (and landlords!) to be forthright about this so everyone is paying their fair share of utilities. It can work in the residents' favor, too. (Keep that karma cool, my friends. (\*\*))
- Town hall is open Monday-Thursday, 8am–5pm, and offers simple services like photocopying, faxing, and a free shuttle to Cottonwood every Wednesday morning at 9am.

Maybe next time I'll share what I've learned about Jerome business licenses. Ooh-la-la. In the meantime, if you have any questions or want to tell me a good Jerome story, I'm all ears. 

You'll receive two Firewise USA street signs constructed for outdoor use, for placement in high visibility locations in your community to promote your wildfire mitigation efforts to all residents.

We look forward to working with you and learning about your community's risk reduction successes!"

The Jerome Fire Department continues to work with the Prescott Area Urban Wildland Interface commission, which helps us in acquiring and maintaining grants and relationships with other communities battling the same risks.

## Jerome Public Library


Born July 29, 1869, Booth Tarkington was a Midwesterner from Indiana. From his first book, "The Gentleman from Indiana," in 1899 until his last one in 1941, he was one of America's most popular writers. In 1918 he won the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction for "The Magnificent Ambersons," which Orson Wells made into a movie. He did it again in 1921 with his novel "Alice Adams," which also became a movie. Tarkington wrote

the Penrod series, which many claimed was as popular as the Huckleberry Finn series. Booth Tarkington died in May of 1946, leaving a legacy of 40 books and some movies. We are happy we have eleven of his wonderful books in our Old Book Room at the Jerome Library.

DONT JUST KILL EVERYTHING. Join the JHS in protecting our environment. Instead of toxic weed killer, try this petand earth-friendly recipe: 1 gallon vinegar, 2 cups Epsom salts, 1/4 cup Dawn dish detergent. Spray on individual weeds and watch them croak!

In the house, try diatomaceous earth to blast bugs. Brush on surfaces and into carpeting to control bugs. Mix with water to spray around the house. DE is safe for pets including birds. It doesn't kill quickly, but it does work. For a fast kill, employ a flip flop! DE is available at hardware and feed stores.
